Running Away From Nineveh

And isn't it true! At your graduation could you have imagined the places you have been to this point in your life? Haven't some of those been places that you never wanted to go?

For years and years I felt blessed to have never gone to New York City. I escaped the assignment on several occasions and I finally decided that one of my life long goals was to never go there. God seems to have seen it differently because one evening I found myself lying in a New York hotel room saying to myself, "This is everything I *never* wanted to do."
