## To Be A Blessing

Among the greatest blessings in my life have been the people who have passed through it. Beyond the blessings of having Godly parents and loving Christian grandparents, many others have blessed my life over the years. Some were friends of my parents, some have been friends of my own, and some have been people who have blessed me along the way without personally knowing them at all.

One person that has been a blessing is my friend Bonnie. I will always remember the time I asked her if she had ever written a personal mission statement. Without hesitation she answered, "To be a blessing." I was struck by the quickness of her response, the certainty she had about it, and the strong commitment her tone of voice told me she had made to it. Years have passed since we had the discussion, but as I reflect now on her reply I realize the depth of the commitment she was making.
