Freedom to Choose

Great mysteries spread through the world we live in, yet we seldom dwell on the miracles surrounding us. The creation and life itself are taken for granted in our everyday activities, so we seldom pause to think deeply about the wonders of it all. Yet there are so many challenging questions about the life God has given us and the reasons He did.

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth; and with it, He created mankind. God envisioned people spread throughout the earth to oversee it. Still each of us has been uniquely made; no two are exactly the same. He gives us differences in appearance, size, personality, and talent. He places us in different environments, speaking different languages, and exposes us to different experiences.
