Noise

"Oh, the noise! Oh, the Noise! Noise! Noise!" cried the Grinch in Dr. Seuss' well known Christmas story. The noise aggravated the Grinch's senses, but generally most of us seem to embrace it. Few hunters are deterred by the noise from firing their shotguns, and noise from rock bands does not seem to discourage concert attendance. Some enjoy the noise of bustling traffic on downtown streets, and even the sounds of nature in a secluded place are highly sought. But what about silence—total silence, why do we not seek it too?

In silence we are left with only the thoughts shooting through our minds.
