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Reflecting on Christmas—Naming the Child

It's one of life's most exciting times. A baby on the way, a new life coming into the world, and one of the first responsibilities of its parents is naming the child. The gender question added excitement to the mystery of new life, but the naming decision was ours to make, an important one. The name given a human life identifies them beyond their time on earth.
