## **Lessons from Job**

We are familiar with the strength of Job's faith from his ensuing trials from this gathering. But from Job's story we learn more about Satan, and we learn more about God.

Satan seemed to have joined the gathering of angels as an uninvited guest. "Where did you come from?" God inquired. "From roaming the earth and going back and forth in it," Satan replied, inferring the havoc his presence brings. Then with angels gathered around him, God accepted the Satan's challenge, but with one rule. "Very well, then, everything he has is in your hands, but on the man himself do not lay a finger." Satan accepted the rule, and went from the Lord's presence to set about his work.

To recall some of the tragedies that befell Job, we remember that he lost his health, his family and friends, his wealth, and his wife's respect.
